Go to the AKC Agility Online Entry Services home page at www.akc.org/AgilityEntry and follow the instructions there to use your My AKC account to enter this event online. During the first 48 hours after opening, the initial limit of entries designated as either online or paper will be as follows: 100 online entries and 200 paper entries each day. If either form of entry (paper or online) has not filled at the end of the 48 hour time period, the club reserves the right to decrease or increase either one accordingly.

E-mail confirmations will be sent to those listing a legible e-mail address on the entry form. If you do not have an email address, and would like to know the status of your entry prior to the issuance of the judging schedule upon closing, please enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope or postcard along with your entry. E-mail preliminary and final confirmations will be sent to those listing a legible e-mail address on the entry form. Entries cannot be changed once the trial has closed.

A full refund will be given to withdrawn entries when wait listed entries are available to replace the pulled entry. Any wait list entry that does not move off the wait list into the trial by November 8, 2020 5 p.m. will receive a full refund.

COURSE FAMILIARIZATION & TIMING

Handlers in all classes are permitted to walk the course, without a dog, during a walk-through period held prior to the start of the class. The walk-through is restricted to handlers entered in that class only. Handlers with multiple dogs, at events with multiple rings may request to walk with a height group other than the one their dog is entered in if a conflict is imminent.

A warm-up area, consisting of a regulation agility jump, may be provided for exhibitors. The warm-up area is to be used exclusively for warming up the dog and not for training or relieving of the dog. Electronic timing devices may be used.

HEIGHT DIVISIONS

****DURING THIS PANDEMIC TIME, AKC HAS WAIVED AKC MEASURING REQUIREMENTS. IF WE HAVE MEASURING OFFICIALS ON SITE, INFORMATION ABOUT MEASURING PROCEDURES WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE FINAL CONFIRMATION INFORMATION. EXHIBITORS WITHOUT OFFICIAL MEASUREMENTS SHOULD ATTEMPT TO ENTER THEIR CORRECT JUMP HEIGHT. ALL RUNS WILL STILL BE ACCEPTED IF A DOG RUNS AT AN INCORRECT JUMP HEIGHT DURING THIS TIME.**

Effective January 1, 2010, exhibitors are no longer required to provide proof to Trial Secretaries that their dog has a valid jump height card as part of the check-in process. Furthermore, this change eliminates the need for a copy of the jump height card to be submitted with an entry form. Dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form may still compete; but they must be measured/measured by the **Judge of Record** PRIOR to running in their class and this measurement will be valid for that weekend of trials only. If a **Volunteer Measuring Official (VMO)** or an **Agility Field Rep** is present; **ALL** dogs without a valid Jump Height Card/Form must be measured at some time during the trial or cluster of trials. This does not preclude having the dog measured by the Judge of Record if the VMO or Rep is not available to measure the dog **before** its first run of the trial or cluster of trials. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog measured prior to running and failure to do so will result in the cancellation of any qualifying scores.

Are You Entered In The Right Height?

If a VMO or Field Representative at a trial measures a dog into a height other than what they entered, the entry may be changed from Regular to Preferred or from Preferred to Regular, as long as the dog has not run any classes that day. If the dog has already run, the change may be made for the next trial day(s). The exhibitor must provide the Trial Secretary the AKC Agility Measurement Form when requesting the class change.

From the South (Castle Rock, Colorado Springs, etc.):

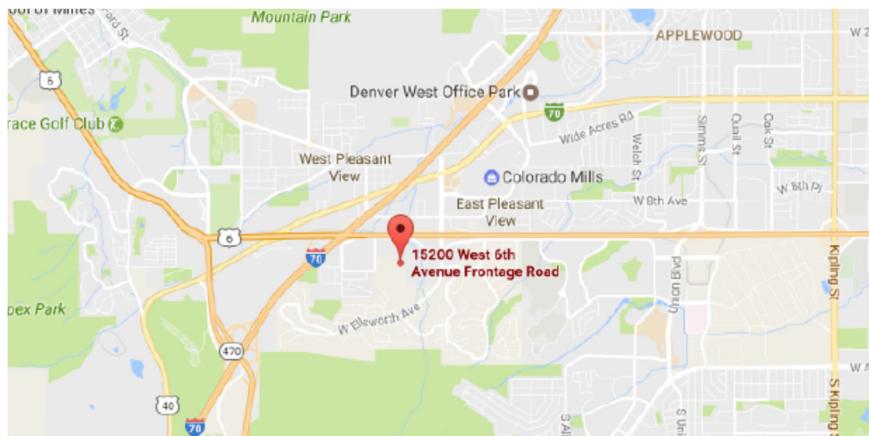
Travel north on I-25 to West 6th Avenue. Exit I-25 at Exit 209B and travel west on West 6th Avenue approximately eight miles. Exit off West 6th Avenue at the Indiana Street/Denver West/Colorado Mills exit. Turn left (south) onto Indiana Street and travel approximately one block. Turn right (west) onto the 6th Avenue Frontage Road and travel approximately two blocks. The main entrance to the Fairgrounds will be on your left. From the West (Evergreen, Idaho Springs, etc.):

EXHIBITOR INFORMATION

SAFETY, BEHAVIOR and LIABILITY

The safety of the dog is our primary concern. By entering this trial, exhibitors acknowledge that they are familiar with the rules and regulations of this sport, and that their dogs are familiar with and able to perform all obstacles safely.

It is expressly understood that exhibitors alone are responsible for the behavior of their dogs and/or children. Any exhibitor whose dogs and/or children create an unnecessary disturbance or repeatedly engage in unsafe or disruptive behavior may, at the discretion of the trial committee, be asked to leave the show site. In such case, no refund of any fees paid will be made. The Mile High Agility Club of Boulder and its agents, employees, etc., will assume no responsibilities for any loss, damage or injury sustained by exhibitors or handlers, or to any of their dogs or property and further assumes no responsibility for injury to children. The Mile High Agility Club of Boulder reserves the right to decline entries for cause and may remove any dog on account of aggression. No one shall have any recourse or claim against the Mile High Agility Club of Boulder or any official thereof.

All dogs must be on leash at all times when on trial grounds except when in the designated warm-up area or competing on the course.

All regulations governing the use of this facility, and all regulations and decisions of the Event Committee at this trial will be strictly enforced, including and not limited to the recorded information of this premium list. Puppies under 4 months of age are prohibited at AKC Agility Trials.

This club does not agree to arbitrate claims as set forth on the Official AKC entry form for this event.

ENTRY ELIGIBILITY

This trial is open to all dogs 15 months or older that are registered with the American Kennel Club or have obtained an AKC ILP/PAL number. Dogs should be physically sound. Dogs that are blind shall not be eligible, and neither are bitches in season, aggressive dogs, or dogs suffering from any deformity, injury, or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance. No dog shall compete if it is taped or bandaged in any way or has anything attached to it for medical purposes. Refer to Chapter 2 of the Registration and Discipline Rules for the listing of registerable breeds that may participate.

Dogs with a Purebred Alternative Listing/Indefinite Listing Privileges (PAL/ILP) or an AKC Canine Partners listing number (in trials allowing mixed breed entries) must be spayed or neutered in order to compete. Wherever the word "dog" is used in these regulations it includes both sexes. Canine Partners are allowed entry into this set of trials.

REFUNDS

No entry fee will be refunded if the trial cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, an act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, or any other cause beyond the control of the organizing committee. No entry fee will be refunded in the event a dog is absent, disqualified, excused, or barred from competition by the action of the Event Committee.

Bitches in season are not permitted to compete in AKC Agility Trials. The Club will issue a refund for the trial entries, less a \$10.00/ entered day processing fee.

Chapter 1, Section 9 of the [Regulations for Agility Trials](http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/REAGIL.pdf), <http://images.akc.org/pdf/rulebooks/REAGIL.pdf>, states, "Females in season must be fully refunded if withdrawn by the Trial Secretary after closing and no later than one half hour prior to the start of the first class of the day of the trial. The club may retain a processing fee and must publish this information in the premium (no fee is paid to the American Kennel Club for females in season who are withdrawn)."

RINGSIDE

Dogs may arrive any time prior to judging. If a measurement is necessary, it is the exhibitor's responsibility to have their dog(s) measured prior to running. All dogs not needed for further judging will be excused.

Judges are not required to wait for dogs. The Owner of each dog is solely responsible for having it ready at ringside when it is to be judged. The Club has no responsibility for providing service through a public address system or stewards or runners for the purpose of calling or locating dogs that are not brought into the ring when required. Food will be available for purchase.

Please keep dogs away from horses at all times.

CRATING and SEATING

Crating areas will be provided on the arena floor. No crating allowed in bleachers, bleacher area, or walkways. There is ample bleacher seating available. The Event Committee reserves the right to regulate and rearrange crating arrangements.

PARKING

Exhibitors are governed by any rules or regulations of civil authorities and building and parking regulations. Vehicles parked contrary to regulations will be subject to towing at owner's expense.

PLEASE NOTE: A limited number of handicap spaces are available. They will be available on a first-come basis. A valid handicap plate must be on each vehicle using these spaces. Parking in front of building is limited to those with handicapped permits and unloading only. THESE SPACES WILL NOT ACCOMMODATE MOTOR HOMES.

Club officials may require that vehicles or equipment be rearranged to accommodate additional vehicles. Area around vehicles MUST be kept clean at all times. All vehicles will be parked at owner's risk. Jefferson County Fairgrounds and Mile High Agility Club of Boulder will not be responsible for loss by burglary, fire, or any other cause whatsoever to the vehicle or its contents.

Entering For Exhibition Only (FEO)

As of January 1, 2020, For Exhibition Only may be offered at the option of the host club. FEO will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FEO will allow exhibitors to work with their dogs in a trial environment. FEO is only allowed in the Time 2 Beat and FAST classes. FEO will be of value to new exhibitors or exhibitors that are having difficulty with a specific obstacle and/or ring environment. Competitors must enter in T2B and/or FAST. Participation in FEO is non-qualifying.

- FEO runs are treated as trial entries. The exhibitor must enter the class(es) (T2B and/or FAST) prior to the closing date, pay class entry fee(s) and the Trial Secretary must record the entry in the Trial Catalog as part of the results for that class. FEO does not need to be noted on the entry form; the handler will declare the day of the show.
- Dogs may be entered in any jump height for FEO runs. If entered in an ineligible jump height, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show jump height changes are not allowed.
- Dogs may be entered in any level of FAST (Novice, Open, Excellent, Master). If the dog is not eligible for the level entered, the team is committed to FEO for that run and must declare FEO on the start line. Day of show level changes are not allowed.
- The exhibitor must declare FEO in the ring prior to leading out. FEO may be declared earlier (ex. when checking in at the gate board).
- Toys are allowed in the ring
 - o Toys must be non-audible
 - o Toys may not leave the handler's hand
 - o Toys that roll freely cannot be used
- Food/treats are not allowed in the ring
- FEO should be utilized for the benefit of the dog and not as a punitive correction. Harsh verbal and /or physical corrections shall not be tolerated. Any determination of harshness by the judge shall be immediately whistled and the handler will be dismissed from the ring.
- A judge must monitor the entire run. Judges can stop a run at any time

Fix and Go On (FNG)

As of January 1, 2020, Fix and Go On will be offered on a one-year pilot basis in order to give AKC time to evaluate its impact. FNG allows exhibitors to immediately reattempt an obstacle at any time while on course when the dog's performance of an obstacle is not to their expectation. This allows the dog to successfully complete the obstacle then finish the course or leave the ring on a positive note. Using FNG will result in a non-qualifying score.

Fix and Go On is not pre-entered; rather, it occurs during the course of the run. FAST CLASSES
Beginning January 3, 2017 the FAST Class has been revised allowing clubs to offer one course that Novice, Open and Ex/Masters can walk and compete in. The goal is to reduce the amount of time that it takes to build separate courses and do multiple walk-throughs. All FAST levels may be combined for single course build and walk through (as entry limits prohibit).

OFFICIAL AMERICAN KENNEL CLUB AGILITY TRIAL MOVE-UP FORM

It is the option of the club to allow day-to-day move-ups. From Chapter 1, Section 20: Move-Up entries will be accepted for dogs that have completed a title after the closing date. Email notification of move up or class change is acceptable, with return receipt verification from the secretary. Either Move Up forms or emails must be completed and delivered to the Trial Secretary prior to 6 PM on the Monday evening preceding the event. Move-up entries for Saturday or Sunday must be delivered to the Trial Secretary within 30 minutes of the conclusion of judging of the class they are moving up from. Dogs so moved up will run at the end of the running order. Move-ups can only be accepted if judging limits are not exceeded.

Entry move-up valid only if the dog was already entered in the Event indicated and only if approved by the Trial Secretary. Dogs moved up will run at the end of the class running order.

Effective February 1, 2017

Regulations for Agility Trials: Chapter 1, Section 21. Change of Entry. In addition to Move-ups as described in Chapter 1, Section 20 entries may also be changed as noted in this section. A dog which has been entered in a Novice "A" class for which it is not eligible to be entered in due to class restrictions on the dog or handler may be moved to the Novice "B" class under the following conditions:

The request for the move must be in writing and presented to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of each trial. The request must state the reason and justification for the move from a Novice "A" class to the Novice "B" class.

After the close of entries a dog may be moved down in their class level (i.e., Master to Excellent). The request for the move to the class for which the dog is eligible must be in writing and submitted to the superintendent or trial secretary at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the trial.
